General Rules & Guidance in Church at this time:

- Church at one metre plus social distancing with compulsory face mask wearing.
- Please do not enter church if you are symptomatic.
- Whilst in church, or the surrounding grounds, all people should adhere to strict social distancing rules at all times.
- Reusable communal resources such as service/hymn books have been removed from use and single use Mass sheets are provided and should be disposed of appropriately at the end of each Mass. Newsletters should be kept or disposed of at the end of each Mass.
- Maximum safe capacity of church if all worshippers are from a different household: 47 (Max 2 per pew).
- Maximum safe capacity of church if worshippers from the same household can sit together (Max 4 to a pew, 3 on the front pews): 79
- Please sanitise your hands on entering & leaving church.
- Please follow one way system & guidance in church on leaving church, those sitting on the left side pews/seats should leave by the left aisle/main entrance door; those sitting on the right side pews/seats should leave by the right aisle/side entrance door.
- Please note the toilet facility in church is closed.
- Following Holy Communion at the very end of Mass, please leave church immediately, not returning to your seat.

<u>Christmas 2020 - Update</u> Many people want to come to Mass at Christmas and normally there is no problem in welcoming everyone. This year circumstances are likely to be different, as numbers who can be accommodated in the church are limited. Father Anthony's thoughts are that there should be four Masses, one on Christmas Eve in the afternoon (say 4.00 pm), one in the evening of the same day (say 6.00 pm), no Mass at midnight, but Mass at 9.00 am and 10.30 am on Christmas Day. Nothing has been decided, but comments would be welcome – we are currently exploring a booking type system where parishioners can email us to indicate which Mass they would like to attend to ensure no oversubscribing occurs – confirmation of this will follow in due course.

Parish 200 Club Sadly, we have had to close the parish 200 club owing to the pandemic. We would like to give our most grateful thanks to both those who have helped to run the 200 Club over the years – notably Christopher Rose-Innes & John Depares, and also you the parishioners who have supported the parish in this way over many years. We have in recent days received a cheque from the 200 club for £1,600 and we are most grateful for this, particularly as members did not request any refunds of their renewal fees on learning of the closure of the club. A most sincere thank you to all.

<u>Parish First Holy Communion 2020</u> – <u>Upcoming Masses Note</u> Our first Communicant, Harrison, will be receiving his First Holy Communion this weekend at the 6.30 pm Mass on Saturday (31st October). Please be aware that during these First Communion Masses, the candidates and their families will receive Holy Communion during Mass & will return to their seats afterwards. Everyone else will receive Holy Communion at the very end of Mass as usual and are asked to leave the church immediately afterwards.

Please also note that next Sunday (8th November) at the 9 am Mass the next three Communicants will be receiving their First Holy Communion along with their families – this will significantly increase the numbers at this Mass so if you able to come to either the 6.30 pm vigil Mass or 10.30 am Mass next weekend, that will help us to keep the congregations within our permitted safe limit.

Please pray for the candidates and their families as they prepare to receive their First Holy Communion.

<u>Caritas at Christmas – Upcoming Retiring Collection</u> The Bishop has asked that a collection be taken for the support of the poor of the Diocese before the end of November.
