The Holy Father has announced a Year of Saint Joseph to be celebrated by the whole Church from 8th December 2020 until 8th December 2021. The year is to mark 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. During this time of crisis across the world Pope Francis invites us "to increase our love for this great saint ... implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal." This is an especially happy announcement for Shrewsbury Diocese that was celebrating a Diocesan Year of Saint Joseph to commend our recovery from this crisis to Saint Joseph's example.

General Rules & Guidance in church at this time

- Church at one metre plus social distancing with compulsory face mask wearing.
- Please do not enter church if you are symptomatic. Please sanitise your hands on entering & leaving church.
- Visitors should not touch or physically venerate statues, relics, or the church stoop.
- Whilst in church, or the surrounding grounds, people should adhere to the social distancing rules at all times. People should only interact with members of their own household and once the Mass is ended, participants should move away promptly to minimise the risk of contact and the spread of infection
- Single use Mass sheets & Parish newsletters are provided and should either be kept or disposed of appropriately at the end of each Mass. Please also note toilet facility is closed in church at this time.
- Maximum safe capacity of church if all worshippers are from a different household: 47 (Max 2 per pew each separated by 1 metre). Maximum safe capacity of church if worshippers from the same household can sit together (Max 4 to a pew, 3 on the front pews): 79
- Please follow the one way system & guidance in church on leaving church, those sitting on the left side pews/seats should leave by the left aisle/main entrance door; those sitting on the right side pews/seats should leave by the right aisle/side entrance door.
- Following Holy Communion at the very end of Mass, please leave church promptly, not returning to your seat.

Father Anthony Homily on The Crib

"The Crib, no more than the celebration of Christmas itself, is not any institution portraying a silly sentimentality. Its origin, by tradition, lies in the wish by Saint Francis of Assisi, to illustrate the scriptural teaching on the Incarnation by visible representation of the Gospels of Matthew and of Luke. Hence the angels, the shepherds, the wise men, but what of the ox and the ass? There is no mention them in the Gospels, but there is a reference to them in the first chapter of Isaiah. (1:3). For the full force of this reference please read Isaiah 1: 1-12.

These words are a reproach to the People of Israel for their infidelity to the God Whom they recognised as their creator and sustainer, the giver of the Law by which they lived. Israel did not recognise the presence of God, but by comparison these dumb animals, who, of course, were incapable of thought, did so. It is a reproach that can be addressed equally to ourselves and to our contemporaries. God's love is such that in the Person of Jesus Christ he became one of us in order to teach the whole human race the way to salvation, to suffer and to die for us, to show his triumph over sin by rising from the dead. Christmas is a celebration of this truth, something that cannot be done if we concentrate totally on material celebration."
