The Catholic Union

Deputy Director of the Catholic Union, James Somerville-Meikle, writes:

"Last week saw the publication of a parliamentary report into assisted suicide. It seems that MPs on the House of Commons Health and Social Care Committee are just as divided as the nation, as the report did not recommend a change in the law one way or another. It did not even recommend another vote in Parliament on the matter; something which proponents of a change in the law had been seeking, although that will not stop some parliamentarians from trying. At the back of the report (p. 100) is an interesting table comparing attitudes of responders to the consultation who were in favour or against a change in the law. Those who were in favour sighted personal autonomy and dignity as their main reasons. Those against sighted risk of coercion or devaluing of life of certain vulnerable groups in society. Assisted suicide is becoming another case where the dividing line is based on whether you view what is right through the lens of individual good or the common good. In a society that seems to prize personal autonomy above anything else, arguments for the common good are getting harder to make. But we need to keep making them, and assisted suicide is one area where we might have some success."

FURTHER THREAT TO THE UNBORN OF ABORTION UP TO BIRTH

In the next couple of weeks an attempt is to be made to widely decriminalise abortion up to the birth. This is a further assault on the sanctity of human life in our society. This extreme amendment to the Criminal Justice Bill is being made by Diana Johnson MP and parliamentarians will be under pressure to support the amendment on grounds of compassion for mothers who seek to abort their unborn child beyond the legal limits. The effect would be to withdraw legal protection from the unborn. It is important to make our voice heard in support of the unborn child. Please contact your Member of Parliament to ask that they oppose the decriminalization of abortion up to birth (Esther McVey - esther.mcvey.mp@parliament.uk). The Right to Life website has details under 'Take Action' which enables you to find and contact your MP directly and the website of the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children has helpful information under 'Resources.' The Right to Life website also has details of an alternative amendment by Caroline Ansell MP to reduce the legal limit for abortion from 24 to 22 weeks on the basis of the increased survival rates for babies being born at 22 and 23 weeks. We cannot doubt the impact which your e-mail or letter will have in making known opposition to decriminalizing abortion up to birth and in support of the value of every human life.

Aid to the Church in Need - Burkina Faso: 'Faith has grown' despite killings

Christians in Burkina Faso under threat from iihadists are not afraid to die for their faith, according to a local Church leader, speaking after the brutal killing of worshippers on Sunday 25th February. Bishop Justin Kientega of Ouahigouya Diocese, north-east Burkina Faso, told Catholic charity Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) that the massacre of 12 people during a prayer service was just one of many incidents of terrorism that have led to the displacement of more than two million people. Bishop Kientega underlined that, despite the difficulties and persecution, Christians have defied terrorists' demands to embrace Islam. He said: "In this situation, some of the Christians accept to die. "Many even refused to remove the crosses they wear. He added that "faith has grown" as the Church has been forced to adapt to the desperate situation. The bishop said: "We know that the Pope is close to us, and we feel the presence of the universal Church. "We get help from ACN, which bring us things that we need. "But the main thing is to pray that the Lord will touch the hearts of these terrorists. We pray for their conversion every day." ACN has supported clergy, religious and seminarians in Burkina Faso with Mass stipends, training fees and vehicles. The charity has also provided emergency aid - including food - to hundreds of people driven out of their homes by the insurgency.
