Holy Week 2022

Palm Sunday marks the start of Holy Week.

We are pleased to announce this year, that following confirmation from the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales last month, we are able to celebrate again the Sacred Triduum with a fully restored rite with a few small changes.

Palm Sunday (10th April)

Please note **10.30 am** mass on Palm Sunday begins with a procession from the parish hall.

Monday 11th – Wednesday 13th April

Please note there will be mass each morning at **10 am** as usual.

Wednesday of Holy Week: The Bishop will preside at the Chrism Mass at Saint Michael & All Angels, Woodchurch at 7.00 pm. This Mass will be livestreamed via this link:

The **Easter Triduum** is a single celebration of the Last Supper, The Lord's Passion and Death, culminating in the Easter Vigil. If possible, please try to come to all three parts.

Holy/Maundy Thursday (14th April): Mass of the Lord's Supper

Please note there will be no morning mass on this day. Father Anthony will be available for Confession from 11 am until 12 noon. Mass will be in the evening at **8.00 pm** followed by watching before the Altar of Repose until 11 pm.

Good Friday (15th April): Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord

The Liturgy of the Lord's Passion will start at **3.00 pm**. Stations of the Cross will follow at 4.30 pm. Father Anthony will be available for Confession after Stations of the Cross.

Holy Saturday (16th April)

There is no public worship on this day until **The Easter Vigil**, which will begin at **8.00 pm**, and marks the first Mass of Easter.

Easter Sunday (17th April)

Masses will be on Easter Sunday at **9.00 am & 10.30 am** as usual.

Diocesan Synod - Information Now Available

Bishop Mark writes, "The Diocesan Listening Phase came to its close at the Cathedral. About 10 clergy and lay people attended and many more may have joined by livefeed. I write to send you the final synthesis of contributions from around the Diocese and the required Episcopal Discernment as the local bishop.

The final document cannot be no more than 10 pages in length and you will find an 8-page synthesis of written contributions and a 2 page episcopal discernment. **(Copies are now available at the back of church)**. The document will also be placed on the Diocesan website together with a video of my own discernment."

Painting the Word: An exhibition of sacred icons at Manchester Cathedral

Opening Times: 22 April - 15 May 2022: 9.30 am – 4.00 pm

Step into the beauty of Manchester Cathedral to meet the sacred Christian art that continues to live throughout millennia whilst remaining true to its original meanings and techniques. The artist, (and one of our parishioners), Veronica Jane Gatti, has been an icon painter and painting teacher since 2003, working in Italy, Scotland and England. Her art is directed towards the knowledge of early Byzantine artists, the colours of Italian Medieval art and the spirituality of Eastern and Western traditions of Christian art. The exhibition, located in the baptismal font area, provides texts of both historical and theological meanings in Iconography to allow you to understand the symbols of each icon.
