Catholic Union Deputy Director, James Somerville-Meikle, writes

"As the missiles fire and bombs fall, most of us at home feel helpless in the face of this escalating war. At times this week I have found myself asking, where is God? Not out of despair, but in hope that in the midst of this darkness there may still be glimmers of light. It is striking that some of the aid agencies still able to operate in Gaza are Catholic. The American group, Catholic Relief Service, has been working to secure humanitarian relief to Palestinian people. Closer to home, CAFOD, has a helpful summary of ways in which people can help. While ACN has published an extremely moving account of a group of religious Sisters in Gaza city who refuse to leave and are standing in solidarity with the people they serve. Friday 27 October was a day of prayer and fasting for peace in the Middle East. This builds on the day that we marked on Tuesday last week and the daily prayers that many of us are offering at the moment for people in Israel and the Palestinian Territories. It may be hard to see God in these troubled times, but it's increasingly clear to see where His Church is."

The Holy Land

Bishop Mark writes, "We are following day by day the horror of the violence which has erupted in the Holy Land. We pray for the release of the hostages, the protection of innocent lives in Gaza and a peaceful resolution of this most deadly crisis in half a century where the vulnerable and the innocent are so often victims. The Latin and Greek Patriarchs of Jerusalem have expressed their hope and prayer for an end to violence, imploring all political leaders and authorities to engage in sincere dialogue for the people of the Holy Land who, they note, have endured the burden of conflict for far too long."

The solemnity of All Saints is on Wednesday 1st November and is a holy day of obligation. There will be two Masses in church – a morning Mass as usual at 10 am and an evening Mass at 7.30 pm.
