Use of the Church Car Park During Mass

Over recent weeks, it has been clear that parishioners have been using the church car park during Mass - but not attending Mass and therefore those parishioners that have come to attend Mass have been unable to park in the church car park.

We would like to remind parishioners that, as stated in the terms of use of the church car park on the permit application form, the use of the car park during Mass times is for the sole use of parishioners attending Mass and no other purpose. **If these terms are not complied with, your pass may be cancelled and no refund given as you would be in breach of the terms.**

Homes for Ukraine Matching Service

Caritas Social Action Network, in partnership with St John of God Hospitaller Services, an international Catholic charity with many services for the vulnerable in the UK and Ireland, have launched a service to bring together Ukrainian people displaced by the brutal war in their country with people in the Catholic community willing to host them in their homes for six months. Once the match is confirmed the Ukrainian guest can apply for their visa.
