Confirmation 2018

Deacon Michael and Father Anthony will run a course during the next months to prepare those of our young people who wish to be confirmed. It will begin late in September or early in October. Seven young people have expressed interest already. Father Anthony asks that they and others who wish to join the programme write a brief note confirming their interest. They will be encouraged that the parish as a community will be praying for them.

The young - and indeed all of us - can take example from the two holy people mentioned by name in today's letter from the Bishop. Saint Therese of Lisieux is the better known. She was born at Alencon in Normandy in 1873, the daughter of Louis and Zele Martin, and entered the Carmelite Convent at Lisieux at the age of fifteen. Her life within the community was apparently humdrum, but she dedicated that life to prayer for the missions and became a powerful advocate. She contacted tuberculosis and died in 1897. She was canonised in 1925, as were both her parents in 2015. There are many vocations within the church.

Pier Giorgio Frassati was born into an influential family in Turin in 1901. He graduated in mining engineering at the Polytechnic of Turin, but had joined the SVP already at the age of seventeen. (It is interesting to recall that the founder of the SVP, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, was twenty and a student at the Sorbonne, when the first conference was formed in 1833). Pier Giorgio Frassati gave his energies and his resources to the poor of Turin, but was active in politics, became a Dominican tertiary (one living the Dominican rule within the world) and was a founder of Pax Romana. Such involvement did not preclude his interest in mountaineering, opera and literature. He contracted polio, probably as a consequence of his work with the poor, and died in 1925. During his funeral procession the streets of the city were lined with the poor. He was beatified in 1990.
